Limit & Blind Structure:

50/100, 25-50 Blinds;	--Break/Chip Change--
100/200, 50-100 Blinds;	1000/2000, 500/1000 Blinds;

GENERAL RULES

1. Players will draw for seating assignments. No changing seats except when instructed by the tournament coordinator.
2. Players are always dealt a hand, even if they are not present at the table. They will have blinds posted for them by the dealer from their stack. A player must be at his or her seat by the time the first card is dealt on the initial deal or they will have a dead hand. Players not at their seat when the first card is dealt may not look at their cards, and the hand is immediately killed after the initial deal. Players must be at their seat to call time. "At your seat" means within reach of your chair.
3. A hand has started when the dealer begins the first riffle.
4. The dealer button remains in position until the appropriate blinds are taken. Players must post both blinds every round.
5. When consolidating games, reseated players must move and be dealt in immediately. Players going from a broken table to fill in seats assume the rights and responsibilities of the seat. The only place they cannot receive a hand is between the small blind and the button.
6. When it is necessary to move a player in order to keep games balanced, the player due for the big blind will be moved to the short-handed game. Player will be moved into the big blind, or the open seat closest to the big blind, in clockwise order.
7. When a player is unable to fulfill the amount of the blind, the blind plays short. Action will continue at the established betting limit. If the player wins the hand, the short amount does not have to be made up.
8. When there is no more betting action because a player is all-in, players must turn hands face-up.
9. At the final table, if two or more players are eliminated on the same hand, the player with the greater number of chips at the start of the hand will be awarded the higher prize.
10. A penalty MAY be invoked if a player exposes any card with action pending, throws a card off the table, violates the one-player to a hand rule, or similar incidents take place. Penalties WILL be invoked in cases of soft play, abuse, or disruptive behavior. Penalties will include verbal warnings and "missed hand" penalties. A missed hand penalty will be assessed as follows: The offender will miss one hand for every player who is at the table when the penalty is given multiplied by the number of rounds specified in the penalty; for the period of the penalty the offender shall remain away from the table. Tournament staff can assess one, two, three, or four round penalties or disqualification. A player who is disqualified shall have his or her chips removed from play. Repeat infractions are subject to escalating penalties.
11. Tournament rules prevail wherever applicable, including selected rules from the TDA. In all other cases, standard Oaks Club Rules apply.
12. Management reserves the right to reschedule or cancel any tournament event if the number of registered participants is deemed inadequate, or for any other valid reason. If an event is canceled all entry fees and buy-ins will be refunded.
13. \$1,500 W.S.O.P. seat treated as a prize, therefore seat winner will be required to provide a Social Security number and valid identification upon receipt.
